The diving extension on the Ti version is usually only found on the "master" line (ie: marine master) and is fantastic. The curved case design is an allusion to the 1960 era and works very well with the solid bracelet.

I guess comparing the Ti and Steel versions highlight's the Ti's appeal to me:

Ti on right...

- the bezel numbering on the Ti Model i find more appealing, as well as the relief/depth of the numbering
- The kevlar weave of the Ti model's face is amazing to view.
- The lighter weight of the Ti model's band and case is offset with the weighty tungsten Bezel (i'm a big fan of Tungsten) and the knurling on the tungsten bezel I find more refined
- The 'divers extension' on the Steel version leaves a bit to be desired (i have it on my Orange Monster) whereas the Ti's extension is found on Marine Masters and other high end Seikos
